

USE OF VIDEO RECORDING SYSTEMS

The District approves of the use of District-authorized video-recording systems on school property, vehicles and buses for the primary purpose of ensuring school safety and security for students, employees and visitors. The District reserves the right to use video monitoring systems at the discretion of the Superintendent and his/her designee. Cameras shall not be placed in areas such as bathrooms or locker rooms where there is a reasonable expectation of privacy.

Conspicuous, public signage (signs of such size and/or location that would be difficult to be overlooked by the average person) should be displayed at all main entrances of buildings and facilities with video recording equipment. Video recording equipment is not continuously monitored and is not intended to create any expectation on behalf of a student, employee or visitor that the video recording equipment is being monitored and that an individual(s) will respond.

Parent/guardians, students, and employees shall be notified annually that video cameras are being used on District premises and in school transportation. Digital video files shall be maintained and considered confidential in accordance with pupil record policies.

Disciplinary action may be taken based on video documentation.

The video recording is a record subject to the public records law.
